# HOW LINEAGE SUPPORTS BREAD AND BUTTER FROM PRODUCTION TO PATISSERIE.

### BREAD AND BUTTER ARE PRODUCED TO PERFECTION FOR DINNER TABLES ACROSS THE GLOBE.

While buttery bread is baked in France, butter is churned in Ireland using milk from grass-fed cows. Because your can't have bread without butter.

Once the bread cools, it is packaged in vacuum-sealed packaging and then blast-frozen to maintain quality. The finished butter is wrapped, packaged and stored in frozen and refrigerated containers for its journey abroad.

### **LINEAGE SECURES ENTRY FOR GLOBAL EXPORT**

While the bread and butter are being prepared, the Lineage freight forwarding and customs brokerage teams handle the export clearance documentation for both shipments to ensure a successful delivery to their final destination in the U.S.

Additionally, Lineage secures space on the vessel and arranges for the drayage of the export container. Then the bread is prepared for export from the Port of Le Havre, while the butter is readied for export from the Port of Dublin.

## BREAD AND BUTTER ARRIVE AT THE PORT OF CHARLESTON

After both vessels arrive in Charleston from their points of origin, the containers are unloaded and put onto a chassis to be drayed to Lineage's Charleston cold storage facility.

#### **CHILLED AND READIED FOR ORDERS**

Upon arrival at Lineage's facility, the containers are unloaded and the boxes are sorted, labeled, palletized and shrink-wrapped before being put into frozen cold storage until a customer order is place.

#### ORDER UP FOR RETAILER SHIPPING

Once a customer order is placed using Lineage Link®, the bread and butter pallets are both pulled from storage, and then consolidated, leveraging Lineage's LTL expertise to maximize trucking capacity. The consolidated order is loaded onto a refrigerated truck and headed to a regional retail distribution center.

From there, the bread and butter are sent to retailers across the country where it will become a buttery bread basket, gooey grilled cheese or so much more – the possibilities are endless with these two kitchen staples.
